Admissions Requirements for the Graduate Certificate:

Applicants must meet minimum coursework, GPA, and graduate admission test requirements. CPAs, lawyers, and those admitted to an accredited graduate program in accounting or to an accredited law school will be automatically admitted. For accountants, prerequisites include principles of financial accounting, intermediate accounting, accounting systems, and auditing. For others, such as those in law enforcement, lawyers, business professionals, psychologists, sociologists, and government accountability and oversight professionals, work experience may be substituted for some or all of the prerequisite courses.
